Wai-Ling serves on the AMOA Board as the National Scholarship Chair. A key Founding Member, Wai-Ling has been instrumental in leading the Asian and Pacific Islander American Scholarship Fund (APIASF) to its successful establishment, with cross country launches culminating in Washington, D.C. She currently represents the AMOA on the inaugural National Board of Directors for APIASF. Wai-Ling and her husband Steve have been McDonald's owner/operators since 1990.

While serving as the AMOA representative on the WON Board of Directors, Wai-Ling was elected to serve in 2001 as Treasurer of the National Women Operators Network (WON) Board of Directors. She was the first Asian to serve as an Officer of WON. In 2002 – 2003, on behalf of the WON, Wai-Ling spearheaded the National McDonald's Mother's Day promotion to fund Breast Cancer Research and Awareness, now an annual campaign which has raised more than a million dollars towards breast cancer research.

Regionally, Wai-Ling serves on the Ronald McDonald House Charities Board and the Public Relations Committee. Previously, she has also served on the Board of Directors for the Co-Op, as well as for the local AMOA and WON boards. Wai-Ling is also the RMHC Scholarship Chair for her Region, and was instrumental in increasing its fundraising to its current contribution of \$150,000 in scholarships to Bay Area youth in 2004.

Within her community, Wai-Ling is very active. She is an Officer of the San Francisco Bay Chapter of the OCA (Organization of Chinese Americans); and is involved in ongoing civic and community organizations such as the Chamber of Commerce, Community Learning Center; and Positive Attendance Campaign for the South San Francisco Unified School District, to name just a few.

Wai-Ling enjoys writing, and has contributed articles which have been published in business newsletters and in Ronald McDonald House Charity's publication, Hearts and Hands.
