Martin J. Coyne was elected to the position of President and CEO of Ronald McDonald House Charities (RMHC) in December 2006. Ronald McDonald House Charities, a 501(c)3, creates, finds and supports programs that directly improve the health and well being of children around the world through its network of Chapters in 50 countries and regions around the world.

From 2001 to 2006, Coyne served as Vice President and COO of RMHC. Coyne first joined RMHC in 1990 as the Director of Development. In these roles, he managed the financial aspects of the Charity, leading all Development efforts, including fundraising and corporate partnerships.

Ronald McDonald House Charities has grown to become a global organization, awarding more than \$460 million in grants and program services to non-profit children's organizations worldwide, including initiatives to increase access to health care for families with children in need. The Charity's cornerstone program, the Ronald McDonald House, offers lodging to families of seriously ill children being treated at nearby hospitals. 277 Ronald McDonald House programs provide more than 6,200 rooms for families each night in more than 30 countries and regions.

From 1983 to 1987, Coyne served at the White House as Director of Development and Special Projects for First Lady Nancy Reagan. Prior to that, he was the Foreign Service Officer with the U.S. Department of State for seven years.

Coyne currently serves as a board member of America's Charities.
